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INTRODUCTION






The 2025 budget is unique, Apart from Education and Works sectors, there is significant change in the prioritization across the key sectors.

The health sector lost its position from been among the top three sectors to forth position. It is slightly above Power and energy that is in the fifth position.




2025 HEALTH SECTOR ALLOCATION AT GLANCE

TREND ANALYSIS OF HEALTH INVESTMENT 2017-2025



The Jigawa state health investment is declining year-in year-out, from achieving 15% Abuja declaration. Between 2021 and 2022 the state allocation is 15%-16%, while between 2024 to 2025 allocation was around 9% only.

Consequent upon the current trend, the achievement of universal health coverage will be difficult within the nearest future, hence the need for consistent investment for health sector is imperative..
